### 2021 Giving Opportunities

**Emergency Department and Level 1 Trauma Center:** This fund is used to support our hospital ED and Trauma Center, and may be used to help upgrade equipment or educate our staff, to provide the best service for our trauma patients.

**Emergency Relief:** CHI Health Emergency Relief funds provide necessary support to our nurses, physicians, caregivers, and staff, and may be used for caregiver wellbeing, resiliency support, coaching for hospital and clinic staff, medical supplies, food, and other needs.

**Forensic Nurse Examiner Program (FNE):** This program seeks to reduce the physical and psychological trauma of sexual assault, human trafficking, and domestic violence through sensitive and timely medical examinations performed by specially trained nurse examiners. Funds are used to educate staff, provide equipment and telehealth capability for examinations, and for community educational outreach. We currently collaborate with the WCA, Project Harmony, and many other organizations to provide care and education to our community.

**General Equipment:** This fund is used to purchase, upgrade, or maintain equipment and other items to support hospital operations, enhance patient care, aid in research, and increase staff productivity.

**General Programs:** Funds are used to support programs that are focused on enhancing patient care, staff productivity, and bettering the community we serve, in line with our mission.

**General Technology:** This fund is used to purchase, upgrade, or maintain hardware and software applications, to aid in patient care, research, and staff productivity.

**Healing Gardens:** This fund is used to maintain and enhance the gardens, located outside the Oncology Department. The gardens provide a beautiful and peaceful place for our patients and families to rest and relax in a natural outdoor setting. Naming opportunities are available.

**Heart Institute:** The Heart Institute provides cardiovascular diagnosis and care, with a staff of over 50 cardiologists and specialists. This fund is used to purchase equipment, educate staff, provide telehealth services, and an expansion of our cardiovascular services. Naming opportunities are available.

**Intensive Care Unit (ICU):** This fund is used to provide specialized technical monitoring equipment including, but not limited to: heart monitors, ventilators, dialysis machines, ECMO machines, and intravenous transfusion equipment, along with specialized staff training.

**Neo-natal Intensive Care Unit (NICU):** This fund will be used for a NICView system. With the onset of COVID and the limitation of visitors to just the parents, people are unable to visit the newest member of their family. Parents and family members will be able to have virtual visits with their babies - they will see the baby and talk via the NICView system in the rooms, using their phones or computers.

**Oncology Department:** This fund will be used to purchase a 3-D printer to assist in treatments for our Radiation Oncology patients. 3-D printing allows for the creation of highly specific molds to match the patient's anatomy. The ability to create such highly customizable accessories can enhance a patient's radiotherapy and decrease unwanted side-effects.

**Patient Assistance:** This fund benefits patients treated at CUMC-Bergan Mercy facilities by providing assistance for prescription medications, transportation, and other health related needs for patients who qualify.

**Professional Development:** This fund supports continued education and training for employees.

**Radiation Oncology 3-D Printer:** As 3-D printing becomes more prevalent, its use in the field of radiation oncology presents several new exciting advancements. 3-D printing allows for the creation of highly specific patient molds to match one's exact anatomy. The ability to create such highly customizable accessories can better enhance a patient's radiotherapy.

**Renewed Hope Boutique:** This fund supports our boutique, that provides items that help to meet the special needs of people living with cancer.
